July 23, 2007 Minutes of the ICC Meeting held at Nora Library

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM by President Mark Eberhardt. 26 members and guests signed the attendance book, but I counted 32 people in attendance.

Visitors introduced were Wayne Moody and Jill Stanley, both of whom signed up as members during the evening. Wayne said he had been a member of the Club about 15 years ago.

The **Secretary's report** and the **Treasurer's report** were read and accepted.

Old Business – Mark reminded the membership that the election of Officers of the Club would be in November, and the Club needs more officers. At this moment, the Club is short one Board member.

There was a lengthy discussion of our meeting place, past, present and future. The option discussed was a move to the 71st street Knights of Columbus Hall. There didn't seem to be many negatives besides the unknown as to whether or not the K of C would continue to let us meet there after a 3 month trial period. Mark said the Board would make a decision later in the week as to whether we would move the Club.

New Business – Secretary, Vinton Dove, reported that the Club had received more Statehood Quarter "boards" (albums) from Patricia Finner in her capacity with the Central States Numismatic Society, and they were available to those who wanted them. He also said that the Club Life Member Jerry Lebo had sent us information about the ANA show in Milwaukee in August, which was also available to the members.

The Educational Program was presented by the Club Vice-President, Jim Roehrdanz. He gave an excellent presentation on the Peace Dollar series. He explained how the series came to be, including an explanation of the Pitman Act and mention of the "trial pieces" coined in 1964 but never released to the public. Jim also had a complete collection of Peace Dollars on display for the members to view. Every coin was certified by the PCGS grading service, and most of the coins were in Mint State condition. He also handed out a "fact sheet" on the coins in the series. His presentation inspired a discussion of the ultimate disposition of the 1964-dated Peace Dollars and other "trial issues" from the US Mint.

Karl Kreck ran the **50/50 Drawing**. The winner was Jim Roehrdanz.

After the break, President Eberhardt then ran an exciting **Auction**. Joe Boling, Karl Kreck and Vinton Dove assisted. The auction included a few lots donated by members, with the proceeds going to the Club.

The club adjourned at 8:40 PM.
